# Katoomba North Public School Behaviour Support and Management Plan

### Overview

Katoomba North Public School is committed to explicitly teaching and modelling positive behaviour and to supporting all students to be engaged with their learning. Key programs prioritised and valued by the school community are second Step and Positive behaviour for Learning (PBL)

## Promoting and reinforcing positive student behaviour and school-wide expectations

Katoomba North Public School has the following school-wide rules and expectations:

Students are to be safe, respectful learners.

Katoomba North Public School uses the following strategies and systems to explicitly teach, recognise and reinforce positive student behaviour and behavioural expectations:

The PBL system-

Students are taught explicit rules and guidelines for how a safe, respectful learner. The school has displayed the PBL guidelines for specific areas eg playground, canteen, classroom so students are aware of respectful safe behaviour expected.

Second Step- an explicit social and emotional wellbeing program which follows themes K-6 including empathy, respect, resilience. Teachers present the lessons weekly using videos and resources.

The school award system of class certificates, executive awards and keys are connected to "points". After 10 points students receive their PBL badge and subsequent stickers and stars.
